ABOUT THE GALLERY – ABOUT OUR TEAM

The National Gallery is one of Australia's leading visual arts institutions. The National Gallery is based in Canberra and is a vital part of the Australian cultural landscape. Our Purpose is to collect, preserve, promote and share the national collection of art. The Vision of the National Gallery is to be the international reference point for art in Australia, inspiring all people to explore, experience and learn. WORKING AT THE GALLERY

When you work at the National Gallery you will be exposed to some of the world's leading Australian and international art and artists. We are located in the National triangle on the waterfront and your lunchtimes can be spent in our beautiful sculpture garden or around Lake Burley Griffin.

WHAT YOU WILL GAIN FROM THE EXPERIENCE – OVERVIEW OF THE ROLE

The National Gallery is seeking applications from highly motivated candidates to, under limited direction and in line with corporate objectives, apply high level infrastructure project management and procurement skills to deliver key capital works initiatives. An Executive Level One position is required to deliver capital works initiatives with roles that include delivery of architectural and engineering projects.

The National Gallery's Capital Works team was established in 2021 to lead delivery of the Gallery's significant capital works program that includes delivery of over \$100 million in capital asset upgrade projects, the establishment of a planned sustainable asset management program for the future, and the delivery of significant or iconic capital works projects.

The Capital Works Team is responsible for providing project management leadership for the delivery of complex, high profile and strategically significant capital works projects. These projects are varied in scope with a focus on positioning the National Gallery as a leading contemporary cultural institution for the future.

Current projects include:

- The Integrated Capital Works Program with design and construction of critical upgrades at the Parkes and off-site facilities.
- Delivery of a major commission by artist Lindy Lee to celebrate the National Gallery's 40th anniversary,
- The sculpture garden revitalisation,
- Development of a new internal café and other possible hospitality initiatives,
- Oversight and planning of the National Gallery's Strategic Asset Management Plan,
- Oversee implementation of the Gallery's Environmental Sustainability Action Plan, and
- Other strategic projects that may be included in the program.

This is a full-time, non-ongoing employment opportunity which may become ongoing.

OUR IDEAL CANDIDATE

Our ideal candidate has extensive experience successfully managing the delivery of capital works projects with a proven track record of delivering a range of complex projects to a high standard. You have demonstrated experience in overseeing, and being accountable for, all aspects of project planning and management including application of work health and safety practices, risk management and mitigation, contract management, financial management, implementation and delivery, and management of a variety of construction and design activities. Strong knowledge of government procurement and budget process is to your advantage. Previous experience in a gallery or museum environment will be highly regarded.

You have a commitment to customer service principles and practices with highly developed written and verbal communication skills, with the ability to liaise and negotiate effectively with a broad range of stakeholders.

Your demonstrated excellent strategic and analytical skills and proven ability to supervise and mentor staff will ensure your success in delivering multiple high profile capital works projects. You have an ability to critically consider issues and challenge requests, as appropriate, providing appropriate alternative strategic decisions or options within legislative, government and National Gallery frameworks, standards and guidelines.

WHAT WILL YOU DO?

In accordance with the Executive Level 1 work level standards and working to the Principal Project Manager - Capital Works Projects, you will have the following key responsibilities:

- Deliver complex and high-risk projects from project inception or an agreed project delivery stage through to financial completion, within time cost and scoping targets.
- Oversee and manage building design processes, and stakeholder consultation.
- Provide exceptional procurement, project, financial and contract management expertise.
- Provide infrastructure project management, including early project planning, the design process, contractual requirements, program control, cost control, alternative delivery methods, quality and statutory requirements.
- Ensure risk assessment includes contingency management and risk mitigation throughout the life of a project.
- Compile and write financial reports and briefs and review technical content of submissions and tender documents for adequacy, compliance, value for money and fitness for purpose.
