ABOUT THE GALLERY

The National Gallery is one of Australia's leading visual arts institutions. The Gallery is based in Canberra and is a vital part of the Australian cultural landscape. Our Purpose is to collect, preserve, promote and share the national collection of art. The Vision of the National Gallery is to inspire creativity, inclusivity, engagement and learning through artists and art. Our Mission is to lead a progressive national cultural agenda by championing art and its value in our lives. Our Values include excellence, creativity, courage, respect and accountability.

The Artistic Programs Portfolio is responsible for the care, loan and presentation of the National collection along with the initiation, development and delivery of the exhibition, touring, publishing and commissioning program at the National Gallery. The Australian Art Department is responsible for researching and delivering loan exhibitions, commissioning projects for the contemporary program, as well as researching, building, interpreting, and publishing on the National Gallery's collection and preparing collection displays.

WORKING AT THE GALLERY

When you work at the National Gallery you will be exposed to some of the world's leading Australian and international art and artists. We are located in the parliamentary triangle on the waterfront and your lunchtimes can be spent in our beautiful sculpture garden or around Lake Burley Griffin.

OVERVIEW OF THE ROLE

This position reports to The Henry Dalrymple Head Curator, Australian Art, and Senior Curator, Australian Art. The Curator works within the Australian Art Department, contributing to the:

- Development

- Research
- Interpretation and
- Promotion of the collection.

The Curator also works collaboratively with members of the Department to strengthen and encourage new ways of understanding and connecting with art and artists.

The Curator, Australian Art position is responsible for contributing to the development and presentation of projects and exhibitions that forge new perspectives. The Curator will also contribute to writing and research to ensure the ongoing positioning of the National Gallery as a place of scholarship and curatorial excellence.

The Curator will work collaboratively with peers and colleagues through national and international networks to foster relationships with artists and to grow the value of the collection, ensuring its greatest possible reach and impact.

This is a full-time, ongoing employment opportunity available within the Artistic Programs Portfolio.

OUR IDEAL CANDIDATE

Our ideal candidate is an experienced curator with broad knowledge of nineteenth century, modern and/or contemporary Australian art. You will support the National Gallery to fulfil its ambition of reconceiving the histories of art from diverse perspectives.

You will have a strong track record of publication and research. Your experience and understanding of the processes of researching, developing and curating exhibitions and displays will be to your advantage. You will also have experience in collection development through acquisitions, gifts and bequests.

You have strong collaborative skills and an established network of contacts. You are resilient, and able to operate in a fast-paced and ever-changing environment. You are a thoughtful and receptive communicator who engages successfully with a wide range of stakeholders.

You have experience in a cross-cultural environment with an understanding and commitment to issues of equality, diversity and inclusion as they affect the work of the Gallery. You will exemplify the Gallery's values and its commitment to achievement, collaboration, and be an agile cultural institution.

WHAT WILL YOU DO

In accordance with APS 6 work level standards, you will have the following key responsibilities:

- Serve as a National Gallery adviser on Australian art and represent the Gallery both nationally and internationally
- Assist in the management of internal and external relationships with community, specialist networks, government, and other stakeholders, working to achieve mutually beneficial outcomes
- 3. Participate in the development of the National Gallery's exhibition, loans, publishing, acquisition, and deaccessioning programs
- Contribute to and curate distinctive exhibitions and displays for diverse audiences, including working
 closely with artists and other key stakeholders to develop exhibitions, collection displays,
 commissions, and publications

- Ensure that First Nations voices, principles and perspectives are embedded throughout the National Gallery's curatorial work
- Develop and model a culture of continuous improvement, including building commitment to shared goals.

- 4. **Commit to action** and take personal responsibility for meeting objectives and progressing your work. Commit energy and drive to see that goals are achieved.
- Value individual difference and diversity by encouraging the exploration of diverse views and
 harness the benefits of these views. Recognise the different working styles of individuals, and factor
 this into the management of people and tasks.
