The *4th National Indigenous Art Triennial: Ceremony* is presented on Aboriginal land and the artists and curators acknowledge the Traditional Custodians of this Country. We acknowledge that this Country is a place of ceremony. Ceremony is not a new idea in the context of our unique heritage, but neither is it something that only belongs in the past. The *4th National Indigenous Art Triennial* reveals how ceremony remains central to the creative practice of First Nations artists. Our people still hold our ceremonial practices close. They are a part of everyday life. From the intimate and personal to the collective and collaborative, ceremony is at the nexus of Country, culture and community.

Ceremony is the fourth iteration of the *National Indigenous Art Triennial*, established in 2007 as the National Gallery's flagship exhibition series.
