To be **eligible** to apply for the Dhiraamalang Wesfarmers First Nations Arts Leadership program, you must:

- Be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent who identifies as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and is accepted as such by their Community. (When applying for this program you may be asked to provide proof or confirmation of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander decent)
- Be over 18 years of age.
- Be able to travel to and stay in Kamberri/Canberra for 12-day residency between 17-29 November 2024.
- Currently work in the arts and cultural sector and
- Have obtained the prior approval of your organisation/manager to apply and, if successful attend the leadership program.

What is the Dhiraamalang Wesfarmers First Nations Arts Leadership Program?

In 2009, the National Gallery of Australia (the Gallery) and Wesfarmers Arts established the Wesfarmers First Nations Arts Leadership Program (the Program) to address the relatively small percentage of First Nations Arts professionals participating in the arts sector.

The Program is an opportunity for First Nations arts professionals to take their leadership to the next level through an immersive cultural and professional development experience.

It brings together a mixed cohort of national First Nations arts professionals who are ready to reflect on their skills, capabilities and what leadership means to them individually. The Program supports First Nations arts professionals to deepen their understanding of the creative sectors and build their network of support. This unique opportunity aims to nurture individuals as their careers progress.

Duration: 10 days

Graduation: Evening, Thursday, 28 November 2024

Value: Return airfares and associated transfer to and from airports, 10-day leadership development course, accommodation and meals with additional per diems for meals not provided.

First Nations arts professional who are at various stages of their careers. The Program attracts arts professionals who are open to new ideas, value learning in a group situation and willing to share knowledge and insights with others. Participants who understand their leadership potential and want to learn more about themselves and their Communities will benefit from this program.

How much does the Dhiraamalang Wesfarmers First Nations Arts Leadership Program cost?

Wesfarmers Arts and the Gallery support participants to undertake the Program.

Costs are covered by the Program such as:

Transfers to and from the Airport, accommodation, return flights and any other transport requirements. We'll look after everything else for you, including On Country learning, facilitation and guest speakers, ground transport, program resources, and most meals for the duration of the program. Meals that are not cover in the program you will be provided per diems. Additional extras such as mini-bar items are at your own expense from your accommodation.

Applications open from 4 July 2024. Every application received is acknowledged via email. During October 2024, all applications will be assessed by a selection panel made up of Gallery staff and First Nations arts professionals. The members of the panel are free to make enquiries and consult anyone they consider necessary to make informed decisions. The selection panel's decisions are final, and no correspondence will be entered into.

Applicants can request feedback on their submission to inform future applications.

Selection of Dhiraamalang Wesfarmers First Nations Arts Leadership participants

The selection of First Nations Arts Leadership participants and the procedures undertaken are at the discretion of the National Gallery. Applicants will be notified of the outcome by mid-October 2024. Names and position of the successful 2024 applicants will be made available to the media and sponsors in mid-October 2024.

Successful applicants will be sent an information pack outlining all the requirements for their attendance to the leadership program at the Gallery. This will include a medical form, photography consent form and 'What to bring' information pack.

You must complete and submit this Application form to the best of your ability, currently work in the arts and cultural sector and have prior approval from your employer.
