OVERVIEW OF THE ROLE

The National Gallery is seeking a qualified Carpenter or Cabinet Maker to join our dynamic Workshop team within the Creative Studio of the Marketing, Communications and Visitor Experience portfolio. Reporting to the Head of Creative Studio, this position supports multiportfolio requirements.

The successful candidate will be responsible for:

- Working with the Head of Creative Studio to support and enhance the creative direction of design at the National Gallery and contribute ideas and fabrication strategy towards exhibitions, collection displays and building projects.
- Participate as a member of a team of subject matter experts supporting the capabilities and growth of the team.
- Supervise, liaise and negotiate with external contractors, consultants, exhibiting artists, designers and NGA staff to ensure exhibitions program design and fabrication requirements are met.

This position reports to the Head of Creative Studio and is responsible for supporting construction, installation and deinstallation of exhibitions, frame and crate fabrication as well as general maintenance projects. This position of Carpenter is an ongoing full-time role within the Creative Studios team.

OUR IDEAL CANDIDATE

Our ideal candidate is a qualified carpenter, joiner or cabinet maker with practical skills and technical knowledge.

You are a collaborator who is results focused with strong skills in communicating, documenting and executing designs from concept to completion.

A clear communicator who confidently conveys fabrication ideas and information in a succinct and interesting way.

You have experience in budgetary control, strong organisational and project management skills and can respond to changes in a fast-paced environment while building and maintaining relationships. You bring a positive attitude and operate efficiently and with integrity In all that you do.

WHAT WILL YOU DO?

In accordance with the APS 4 work level standards, you will:

- With limited supervision, develop and implement design solutions from concept to functional outcomes, in collaboration with exhibition designers, artists, curators, conservators and exhibition staff to ensure the safe display of works of art for temporary exhibitions, permanent collection displays and ensure brand initiatives are delivered on time and within budget.
- 2. With limited guidance, oversee the operation of specific construction and fabrication projects and monitor workflows to achieve the sections strategic objectives and deadlines.
- 3. Participate as a member of the exhibition project team and provide advice on design, fabrication and construction matters as required.
- 4. Ensure effective liaison with staff at all levels, external stakeholders and other relevant organizations to meet Gallery objectives.

To be successful in this role you will need to demonstrate, or have the ability to develop the following,

- Inspire a sense of purpose and direction by providing direction to others regarding the purpose and importance of their work. You will illustrate the relationship between operational tasks and organisational goals. You set work tasks that align with strategic objectives and communicate expected outcomes.

 operational requirements accordingly. You consider the ramifications of issues and longer-term
 impact of own work and work area.
- **Ensure closure and deliver on intended results** by seeing projects through to completion. Monitor project progress and adjust plans as required. You are committed to achieving quality outcomes.
- Nurture internal and external relationships by building and sustaining relationships and networks with key stakeholders. You will be proactive in your work and be responsive to internal and external client needs.
- **Demonstrate public service professionalism** by adopting a principled approach and adhere to the National Gallery's values and code of conduct in all that you do. You are professional and impartial and operate within the boundaries of National Gallery's processes and legal obligations.
