NGA announces three major shows in 2018 and secures ACT Government funding

The line-up of exhibitions at the National Gallery of Australia next year is set to draw crowds to Canberra with the support of funding from the ACT Government's new major events fund.

Hyper Real 20 October 2017 – 18 Feb 2018 Tickets on sale now

Hyper Real provokes reflection, fascination, fear and joy from eerily lifelike sculptures to outof-this-world virtual reality. This major exhibition charts the evolution of hyperrealism into the 21st century. Hyperrealism—paralleling photorealism in painting—began in the 1960s and 70s when a number of sculptors became interested in a form of sculptural realism based on a vivid and lifelike representation of the human figure. From kinetic sculpture to bio art, this summer's exhibition extends our perception of what constitutes the hyperreal.

Opening at Easter in 2018, *Cartier: The Exhibition* is an experience unlike any other Australian exhibition. More than 300 works of art and exhibition themes that include The Age of Glamour, Icons of Style and Royal style with loans from royal families, celebrities and the astonishing Cartier collection itself.

NGA and ACT Government partnership

The ACT Government has confirmed it will continue to support the NGA's major exhibition program following the announcement of its 2025 Major Events Strategy and is the Presenting Partner for these two exhibitions. Love and Desire: Pre-Raphaelite Masterpieces from the Tate 4 December – 22 April 2019

Last, but definitely not least, *Love and Desire: Pre-Raphaelite Masterpieces from the Tate*, opens on 14 December next year. It will include some of the most celebrated works from this truly romantic period in art, when a group of young radical artists in mid-19th century Britain developed an astonishingly realist style (inspired in terms of technique and subject matter by art from the period before Raphael and the High Renaissance in Italy), creating a new art mixing medieval romanticism with modern life. The themes of Love and Desire will take over the NGA during this time and visitors can look forward to a romantic, poetic experience in Canberra.
